

LINCOLN LAW SCHOOL OF SAN JOSE'S DISCLOSURE STATEMENT – Fall 2023

(pursuant to Rule 4.241 of the Unaccredited Law School Rules and Business and Professions Code §6061)

1. Lincoln Law School of San Jose (“LINCOLN”) is not accredited by the Committee of Bar Examiners of the State Bar of California (“COMMITTEE”).
2. LINCOLN has not applied for accreditation with the COMMITTEE in the previous five years. The COMMITTEE placed LINCOLN on probation in 2021, due to reporting five-year cumulative bar exam pass rate (MPR) of 30.9 percent for 2020, when a minimum of 40 percent is required under Rule 4.160(N) of the Accredited Law School Rules. The COMMITTEE terminated LINCOLN’S accreditation effective December 31, 2022 under Rule 4.173(A)(1) of the Accredited Law School Rules which states: “[t]he Committee may terminate...accreditation if it finds...(1) the law school has failed, during a period of probation, to demonstrate...compliance...with one or more of the rules or to meet the terms of its probation.” On August 19, 2022, the COMMITTEE approved LINCOLN’S request for Registration as an Unaccredited, Fixed-Facility Law School, with a confirming inspection set for 2023.
3. To ensure prospective students of, applicants to, and students of a law school’s J.D. degree program are fully informed about the requirements and possible limitations associated with attending and graduating from an unaccredited law school, LINCOLN is required to make the following disclosure of information:

The method of instruction at this law school for the Juris Doctor (J.D.) degree program is principally in physical classroom facilities.

Students enrolled in the J.D. degree program at this law school who successfully complete the first year of law study must pass the First-Year Law Students’ Examination required by Business and Professions Code § 6060(h) and Title 4, Division 1, Chapter 1 Rule 4.3(l) of the Rules of the State Bar of California as part of the requirements to qualify to take the California Bar Examination. A student who passes the First-Year Law Students’ Examination within three (3) administrations of the examination after first becoming eligible to take it will receive credit for all legal studies completed to the time the examination is passed. A student who does not pass the examination within three (3) administrations of the examination after first becoming eligible to take it must be promptly disqualified from the law school’s J.D. degree program. If the dismissed student subsequently passes the examination, the student is eligible for re-enrollment in this law school’s J.D. degree program, but will receive credit for only one year of legal study.

Study at, or graduation from, this law school may not qualify a student to take the bar examination or to satisfy the requirements for admission to practice in jurisdictions other than California. A student intending to seek admission to practice law in a jurisdiction other than California should contact the admitting authority in that jurisdiction for information regarding the legal education requirements in that jurisdiction for admission to the practice of law.

9. The education and degree provided by LINCOLN may not satisfy the requirements of jurisdictions other than California for the practice of law. Applicants should contact the jurisdiction in which they may want to practice for that jurisdiction's requirements.

10. LINCOLN was issued a Notice of Noncompliance by the COMMITTEE in August 2020 regarding Rule 4.106(N) and Guideline 12.1 of the Accredited Law School Rules, under which all accredited law schools are required to maintain a Minimum, Cumulative Five-Year California Bar Examination Passage Rate (MPR) of 40%.
